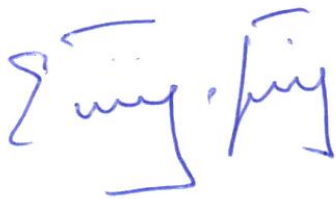

It defines the roles and relationships of the Governing Board, Senate, Executive Leadership, committees, and other governance structures while promoting accountability, transparency, integrity, and efficient institutional coordination. Importantly, it also recognizes the unique developmental and transitional realities of an emerging institution and provides mechanisms for progressive institutional maturation.

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## **I. POLICY FOUNDATIONS**

### **1. Preamble**

The Elon Musk University of East Africa (EMUEA) Governance Policy establishes the framework for **institutional leadership, decision-making, accountability, and oversight**.

As a digital and placement-based university, EMUEA adopts a governance model that ensures:

- **Academic independence and integrity**
- **Efficient and transparent decision-making**
- **Accountability across all institutional levels**
- **Alignment with its innovative Placement-Based Education for Impact (PBEI) model**

- Executive leadership

#### **3.2. Stakeholders**

- Institutional leadership
- Academic staff
- Administrative staff
- Students (where applicable in governance)
- External partners (in advisory roles)

### **4. Definitions of Key Terms**

- **Governance:**  
Systems and processes for directing and controlling the institution
- **Governing Board / Council:**  
The highest authority responsible for overall institutional oversight
- **Senate:**  
The highest academic authority responsible for academic matters
- **Executive Leadership:**  
Operational leadership responsible for implementing decisions
- **Committee:**  
A body established to support specific governance functions

## **5. Core Principles of Governance**

### **5.1. Accountability**

All decisions and actions must be **justifiable and transparent**.

### **5.2. Academic Independence**

Academic decisions must be made **independently and free from undue influence**.

### **5.3. Transparency**

Processes and decisions must be **clear and open**.

### **5.4. Efficiency**

Governance structures must support **timely and effective decision-making**.

### **5.6. Alignment with PBEI**

Governance must support:

## **II. FOUNDING AND TRANSITIONAL LEADERSHIP**

### **1. Foundational Governance Phase**

During the establishment and developmental phase of the Elon Musk University of East Africa (EMUEA), the University may operate under transitional governance arrangements to ensure institutional coordination, strategic development, and operational continuity prior to the full establishment of all governance organs.

This transitional phase supports:

- Institutional establishment and growth
- Development of academic and operational systems
- Regulatory and accreditation processes
- Strategic partnerships and institutional positioning
- Progressive implementation of the University's governance framework

### **2. Founder and Project Lead**

The Founder and Project Lead shall provide strategic and developmental leadership during the foundational phase of the University.

#### **2.1. Role**

The Founder and Project Lead shall:

- Guide the establishment and strategic direction of the University
- Coordinate institutional development initiatives
- Support the development of governance, academic, and operational systems
- Facilitate institutional partnerships and external engagement
- Promote the vision, mission, and philosophy of EMUEA

#### **2.2. Transitional Authority**

During the foundational phase, the Founder and Project Lead may exercise transitional coordination responsibilities necessary for:

- Institutional organization

- Policy development
- Establishment of governance and administrative structures
- Appointment of interim institutional leaders and officers
- Strategic decision-making
- Institutional development and operational readiness

### **2.3. Limitation of Transitional Authority**

The transitional responsibilities of the Founder and Project Lead shall progressively transition to formally constituted governance organs and executive leadership structures as the University develops institutional capacity and operational maturity.

## **3. Transitional Executive Leadership**

During the foundational phase of EMUEA, the Founder and Project Lead may appoint interim or acting executive leaders to support institutional development, operational readiness, and governance implementation prior to the full establishment of formal governance organs.

### **3.1. Interim Leadership Appointments**

Interim appointments may include:

- Executive Vice Chancellor
- Vice Chancellors
- Deans
- Directors
- Other institutional officers as necessary

### **3.2. Purpose of Interim Appointments**

These appointments shall support:

- Institutional operations and coordination
- Academic and administrative development
- Policy implementation
- Student and stakeholder support

- Regulatory and accreditation processes

### **3.3. Transitional Nature of Appointments**

All interim and acting appointments made during the foundational phase shall remain subject to:

- Future review by formally constituted governance organs
- Institutional restructuring where necessary
- Confirmation, revision, or replacement in accordance with established University governance procedures

## **4. Progressive Establishment of Governance Structures**

### **4.1. Governance Structures**

These include:

- Governing Board / University Council
- Senate
- Executive Leadership
- Committees and Sub-Committees

### **4.2. Institutional Transition**

As governance structures become fully operational:

- Transitional arrangements shall progressively reduce
- Authority shall transfer to formally constituted governance bodies
- Institutional governance shall operate under the established governance framework of the University

## **5. Commitment to Institutional Sustainability**

EMUEA is committed to building sustainable, accountable, transparent, and academically independent governance systems capable of supporting the long-term mission and growth of the University.

### **III. CHANCELLOR**

#### **1. Establishment of the Office of the Chancellor**

EMUEA shall establish the Office of the Chancellor as the highest ceremonial, symbolic, and strategic office of the University.

##### **1.1. Status**

The Chancellor is:

- The ceremonial head of the University
- A custodian of the institutional vision, identity, values, and heritage
- A symbol of continuity, inspiration, and institutional integrity

#### **2. Role and Functions of the Chancellor**

The Chancellor shall provide ceremonial, symbolic, and strategic leadership in support of the long-term mission and development of the University.

##### **2.1. Functions**

The Chancellor shall:

- Promote the vision, mission, values, and philosophy of the University
- Represent the University during major ceremonial and institutional functions
- Support institutional development, partnerships, and public engagement
- Encourage continuity of the founding vision and institutional heritage
- Serve as a unifying symbol of the University community

##### **2.2. Limitation of Authority**

The Chancellor shall not exercise direct executive, administrative, financial, or academic control over the day-to-day operations of the University.

Operational, governance, and academic authority shall remain vested in:

- The Governing Board / University Council
- The Senate

- The Executive Leadership structures of the University

### **3. Founding Chancellor**

During the foundational phase of the University, the Founder and Project Lead shall serve as the Founding Chancellor of EMUEA in recognition of his role in establishing and developing the institution.

#### **3.1. Continuity of Institutional Heritage**

The Founding Chancellor may designate or recommend a successor Chancellor aligned with the mission, values, philosophy, and long-term interests of the University, subject to recognition by the Governing Board / University Council.

### **4. Appointment and Recognition of Future Chancellors**

Future Chancellors shall be recognized or confirmed in accordance with the governance procedures of the University.

#### **4.1. Qualifications**

The Chancellor should be an individual of:

- Distinguished integrity and credibility
- Commitment to education and institutional development
- Alignment with the mission and values of EMUEA
- Capacity to uphold the dignity and long-term interests of the University

### **5. Relationship with Governance Structures**

The Chancellor may:

- Participate in major institutional functions and ceremonies
- Provide strategic and advisory guidance where appropriate
- Serve as a ceremonial and advisory member of the Governing Board / University Council where applicable.

The Chancellor shall respect the independence and authority of the University's governance and academic structures.

## **IV. GOVERNING BOARD / UNIVERSITY COUNCIL**

### **1. Establishment of the Governing Board**

EMUEA shall establish a **Governing Board (University Council)** as the highest authority responsible for **overall institutional governance and oversight**.

#### **1.1. Status**

The Governing Board is:

- The supreme decision-making body of the University
- Responsible for strategic direction and institutional integrity

### **2. Functions and Powers of the Governing Board**

The Governing Board shall exercise authority over all major institutional matters.

#### **2.1. Strategic Oversight**

The Board shall:

- Approve institutional vision, mission, and strategy
- Guide long-term development of the University

#### **2.2. Policy Approval**

The Board shall:

- Approve institutional policies (academic, administrative, financial)
- Ensure alignment with legal and regulatory requirements

The Board shall include individuals with relevant expertise and independence.

### **3.1. Membership**

Members may include:

- Institutional leadership representatives
- Academic representatives
- Professionals from relevant sectors
- Independent external members

### **3.2. Expertise**

The Board should collectively represent expertise in:

- Education and academia
- Public health and professional fields
- Governance and law
- Finance and management

- Technology and innovation

### **3.3. Independence**

The Board must:

- Include independent members
- Avoid conflicts of interest
- Ensure balanced decision-making

## **4. Chairperson and Leadership of the Board**

### **4.1. Chairperson**

The Board shall have a Chairperson responsible for:

- Research and ethics representatives

#### **3.2. Expertise**

- Quality assurance and curriculum development

## **4. Academic Independence**

The Senate operates independently in academic matters.

### **4.1. Independence**

The Senate shall:

- Make decisions free from undue external influence
- Ensure academic decisions are evidence-based

### **4.2. Protection of Standards**

The Senate ensures:

- Integrity of academic programmes

## **5. Meetings and Decision-Making**

Executive Leadership is responsible for:

- Implementing decisions of the Governing Board and Senate
- Managing institutional operations
- Ensuring effective functioning of all systems

### **2. Executive Vice Chancellor**

The Executive Vice Chancellor shall serve as the principal executive coordinator and chief operational leader of the University.

#### **2.1. Authority**

The Executive Vice Chancellor shall:

- Ensure implementation of Board and Senate decisions
- Coordinate the work of Vice Chancellors

### **3. Vice Chancellors**

- Digital Learning and Technology
- Student Affairs and Community Engagement

### **3.1 Functions of Vice Chancellors**

Vice Chancellors shall:

- oversee their designated institutional portfolios,
- support implementation of institutional strategy,
- coordinate academic or administrative functions within their areas,
- report to the Executive Vice Chancellor where applicable.

## **4. Senior Management Team**

The Executive Vice Chancellor shall be supported by a Senior Management Team.

### **4.1. Composition**

This may include:

- Academic leadership (e.g., Deans, Programme Heads)
- Administrative leadership (e.g., operations, finance, IT)
- Quality assurance and compliance officers

### **4.2. Functions**

The Senior Management Team shall:

- Implement institutional policies
- Coordinate academic and administrative functions
- Support programme delivery and student services

## **5. Administrative Functions**

Executive Leadership oversees all administrative functions.
